**Sunrise Children's Services and Christian Care Communities**  
**Sign Letter of Intent**

**LOUISVILLE, KENTUCKY (August 16, 2007)** – The Boards of Directors of Sunrise Children's Services and Christian Care Communities have signed a "Letter of Intent" for Sunrise to explore the possibility of acquiring Christian Care's Children and Families Program, based in Danville and Henderson, Kentucky.

The Letter of Intent, approved by both Boards on July 27, 2007, opens the door for Sunrise Children's Services and Christian Care to formally discuss this possibility. Any future definitive agreement would require the approval of both the Sunrise and Christian Care Boards.

Sunrise Children's Services and Christian Care have much in common, including their not-for-profit, faith-based missions and strong financial positions. Christian Care was founded in 1884 and Sunrise in 1869 with a singular focus to care for orphans.

Today, Sunrise Children's Services serves more than 2,200 children in communities across Kentucky, providing a broad range of specialized services, including residential services, family counseling, foster care, adoption services, and the Cumberland Adventure Program.

Christian Care's program for Children and Families in Danville provides comprehensive treatment programs, including crisis intervention for children, psychiatric residential treatment facilities, therapeutic foster care and adoption services. Christian Care's program for Children and Families in Henderson provides specialized counseling services to at-risk children and families. In 2006, Christian Care's Children and Families Program served 514 children and families.

Sunrise Children's Services is a not-for-profit, faith-based agency that has served Kentucky's youth for over 138 years. From its humble beginnings in downtown Louisville to today all across Kentucky, Sunrise has 300 employees and is ready to serve any child in crisis.
